At the request of the Western Australian Bishops, Year 3 and Year 5 students will take part in The Bishops' Religious Literacy Assessment. The Year 5 assessment took place on Wednesday 9 August and Year 3 assessment is scheduled for Wednesday 16 August. These assessments provide an indication on how students are progressing in relation to their Religious Education knowledge.

THREE-YEAR OLD PROGRAM

Our Three-Year Old Kindergarten Program at lona is an educational program for pre-kindergarten children. The program is very much play-based and helps the children develop independence and creativity by offering inquiry-based learning based on each individual child's interests. Our program has recently been assessed by the Education and Care Regulatory Unit (ECRU) as exceeding the National Quality Standards of Early Childhood Education in all 7 Quality Areas.

Who May Attend?

The program is offered to children who will have turned **THREE.** Regulations prevent us from taking children until they have turned three.








MercyCare is the leading not-for-profit catholic provider of aged care, family, health, disability and community services. Our Community and Home
